#### **College Photographs**


All students should have received a photography envelope from Academy Photography at school this week. If your child has not received one, please contact the

#### St Joes Defend Title

The St Joseph's Inter-School Swimming Team boarded the bus for the carnival that was to be held at ALAC on 23 March. The team had high expectation after their ACC success and were keen to go into the pool for their warm up session, before the commencement of the first race.

Jemma Pouwelsen opened the account for St Joseph's with a massive 10 second win in the 100m freestyle, setting a new carnival record. The remainder of the team followed up with strong performances in the 100 metre freestyle and the backstroke events.

The St Joseph's cheer squad had plenty to cheer about when Callie McNamara had a victory in the 50 meter backstroke to claim a new carnival record. St Joseph's continued their domination of the girls section of the carnival with solid performances in the medley relay with records in the under 13, 14 and 16 girls events.

Jemma Pouwelsen carried on her domination with carnival records in the 50 metre butterfly and 50 metre freestyle events. Promising performances by the remainder of the team ensured we were in a good position at the start of the freestyle relays.

Carnival records tumbled when the under 13, 14 and 16 girls all claimed records in their respective freestyle relays, ensuring St Joseph's a good position as the climax of the carnival in the form of the open males freestyle relay. This event did not disappoint with our seniors claiming victory over Great Southern Grammar with 0.38 of a second to spare. This cemented the schools position at the top of the table.

#### **Senior School Football**

The Football season for the Senior School boys commenced on Tuesday 16 March with a home game as the season opener in the St Joseph's College vs Great Southern



Football Academy Cup. The game was the first in a three match series to be played this year with the winning side taking home the shield in this inaugural year of the Senior Division.

With a close to full strength side St Joseph's started solidly with some great centre clearances by the centre combination of Bronson Leo (1 goal) and Michael Betti (1 goal). St Joseph's saw plenty of the ball in their forward zone but struggled to convert scoring opportunities into goals with some inaccurate kicking. Travis Hunter (1 goal) was creative inside 50 metres to see plenty of the ball.

The Great Southern Football Academy (Clontarf) rallied strongly in the second and third quarters with some relentless play and moved ahead on the scoreboard due to their pinpoint accuracy with shots on goal. Fraser Grant and Tom Palfrey were stand out players hitting the ball hard and racking up the possessions.

St Joseph's fired again in the final quarter following an impressive burst out of the centre and forward charge by Captain Betti early in the quarter. The defence remained solid with Heath Blakers shining and Darcy Norman displaying some slick pick ups and disposals. Will Boston also ran hard attacking the ball and finding some effective disposals.

The final score flattered the GS Football Academy winning 11.4.70 to St Joseph's 3.11.29. Stand in coach for the match, Cameron Newbold, put the match in perspective in his post game review by reminding the players it was just the accuracy on goals that was the difference between the two sides. With this in mind the side looks forward to the first game of the Belt Up Cup season during week two next term on Wednesday 28 April.

Seatbelts in School Buses - You Must Wear Them!

You may have noticed that some school buses now have seatbelts. As part of the Towards Zero campaign, there is a transition to having seatbelts on school buses and eventually all buses will have them.

While travelling by school bus is one of the safest forms of transport (thanks largely to the skills of our wonderful bus drivers), seatbelts will make them even safer and where they are fitted it is a requirement that YOU MUST WEAR THEM.

If you don't, there is a \$500 fine and unlike fines in ordinary cars, this is applied to the passenger, not the driver. What is perhaps an even more serious penalty is that consistent failure to use a seat belt may lead to a student being excluded from school buses and thus having to find some other way to school.

Police will soon start doing spot checks on buses to ensure every one has buckled up and fines may be issued. So..... Students, keep those pretty faces of yours pretty and make sure that every time you are in a school bus with a seatbelt, that you put it on.

Parents, please reinforce with your children the need to wear the seatbelts, firstly for the sake of safety but also to avoid the penalties that will accompany not doing so. Crispin Travers
