# **Change of Term Dates for 2011**

The Minister has advised a minor adjustment to the 2011 term dates for public schools in Western Australia.

The last day of Term 1 for students and teachers will now be **Tuesday 19 April** (previously Thursday 21 April), and students and teachers will begin Term 2 on **Thursday 5 May** (previously Monday 9 May). This adjustment will give students three days before they sit the NAPLAN tests. St Joseph's College will adopt these new dates in its school calendar in line with regional public schools and regional bussing arrangements.

The assessment program is offered to all Western Australian schools in the public, Catholic and in many independent schools.

# What is assessed in Years 5, 7 and 9? Science

Students' achievement in the four conceptual outcomes and the process outcome, *Investigating*, is assessed.

#### **Society and Environment**

Students' achievement in the five conceptual outcomes and the process outcome, *Investigation, Communication and Participation (ICP)*, is assessed.

### Who develops the assessments?

The assessments have been developed specifically for Western Australian schools by the Department of Education and the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER).

#### When will the assessments be conducted?

The assessments will take place in school time during the third week of Term 3 (2 to 6 August 2010).

#### Who Am I?

Year Nine students began their transition from Middle School to Senior School this week. Students were involved in three activities working with their fellow House members. On the first day, students attended the WARE facility at the Hanrahan Refuse facility. Students were taken through the process of recycling, landfill and reusing by Carly Madden, the Education Officer for Cleanaway. After a brief 7km walk to Frenchman's Bay, students were met by Mark Ford, Weed Control Officer for the City of Albany who explained the problem of Victorian Tea Tree in the Albany Environment. Inspired by his presentation, the students quickly removed over 500 tea tree saplings in less than 45 minutes! The next task was a long paddle on the 'Kalgan'. The students, in either pairs or threes, explored the upper end of the river over four hours. This paddle was their introductory canoeing instruction before the 'big' expedition on the Term Four Camp. Students then spent a day at Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre mastering snorkelling procedures including signals and entries followed by conquering the climbing wall! Finally, students reflected, recounted and prepared an individual ereport on their experiences during the week. students supplemented their written responses with the many appropriate photographs that illustrated aspects of their identity and presented this portrayal of themselves to their House members.
