Eagles Cup Football St Joseph's v. Mt Barker

The St Joseph's Eagle's Cup team were again on a road trip in Round 8 to Mt Barker. A strong breeze was blowing providing testing conditions for the players



of both teams. Mt Barker proved early that knowledge of the ground would be to their advantage with long kicking to position, threatening to provide St Joseph's with a strong challenge. St Joseph's made a sluggish start with a congested forward line and early turnovers. Claudia Monterosso proved elusive and with some quick feet snapped towards goal, unlucky to have the breeze blow the kick off line. Wayward kicking in the strong breeze saw St Joseph's register only one goal in the first term with Jackson Heinz finding space converting from a strong mark.

The second term saw a more settled St Joseph's team provide staunch defence from Adelle Offerman. Strong running from the backline from Jeffrey Ledwith and Ben Donkin displaying silky skills together with some strong marking constantly repelled Mt Barker and provided opportunities to the St Joseph forwards. Adam Williamson provided a strong marking target up forward along with Jake Hooper, however the strong wind proved difficult to score against and St Joseph's finished the term registering only a single behind.

The Third quarter saw the mid field continue their domination of the game with Layton Taylor proving a constant headache to Mt Barker with his constant running and skills by hand and foot, launching repeated attacks into the forward 50. Fraser Powell continued his good work during the second term in providing a reliable target through the centre corridor. Corey Rogers continued his domination in the air and his long kicking resulted in a major from half forward. Jacob Oostdam registered the goal of the day with a long bomb clearing the pack for a goal from the 50m line!

The final quarter saw the Year 5 contingent Mitchell Hughes-Owen and Jordan Muir show some good teamwork and run to set up a number of attacks against the wind. With growing confidence Jordan Muir took 'mark of the day' with a great, overhead screamer under enormous Mt Barker pressure. He wasted no time in playing on, to find a target in Adam Williamson centering the ball to Rogers who duly marked and goaled. Jordan followed up a short time later with a goal after finding space on his own.
