
DEEWR State Managers Visit

Eagles Cup Report - Round 9 St Joseph's v. Spencer Park

The St Joseph's Eagle's Cup team were host to Spencer Park in Round 9. With conditions near perfect a high standard game was anticipated. However, it seemed that the week lay-off would prove costly to St Joseph's as, despite dominating possession, their ball handling skills and missed opportunities saw Spencer Park create a handy break. With hard running and excellent team-work Spencer Park grabbed an early lead and through some uncharacteristic defensive errors and missed opportunities from St Josephs, Spencer Park was able to maintain that lead at the first break.

St Joseph's however were not to be denied and responded well. Good forward positioning and teamwork saw the mid-field set-up numerous forays into the forward 50. Matthew Ellul, Jackson Hines and Stewart Davies rotated well in the ruck providing solid contests at the bouncedown to create opportunities for midfield clearances. Declan Howarth began to dominate proceedings, leading up from full forward and converting with solid overhead marking and accurate kicking. St Joseph's had regained the lead with 5 unanswered goals, however Spencer Park were not to be denied with their mid-field brigade running hard to kick accurately and score 2 late goals to ensure they stayed in the contest.

The third quarter saw Spencer Park continue to provide our mid-field with headaches as they ran hard to launch attacks into their forward 50. Jeffrey Ledwith, Ben Donkin and Luke Dupuy had their hands full but proved reliable in repelling Spencer Park's repeated attacks and maintaining an even contest for the period. Declan McNamara stepped up to play a run with role on Spencer Park's best player and reduced his impact for the remainder of the quarter. Caleb Gill began to find his range and proved his fitness was making a difference when he marked, played on and kicked truly to provide St Joseph's sole major for the term.

The last quarter saw Layton Taylor continue his 4 quarter effort running hard, marking and kicking to position to provide the forwards with opportunities to convert. Jeffrey Ledwith continued his impressive rebound defence to kick the goal of the day from long range and with Lincoln Joy proving elusive and knowing where the goals were, chimed in with 2 late goals to put the result beyond doubt.

Trade Training Centre Talk Short Delay for Clay

During the scraping of the site to remove the turf, the builders ran across a small problem involving unstable subsoil clay. This has resulted in the contractors having to bring in clean fill sand, a delay of about a week. As a result the level of the site has been raised by approximately 400mm. The site has subsequently been compacted, levelled and surveyed. Car parks, driveways, etc have been gravelled and all major drainage has been installed.

With earth works completed, Smith Constructions have A set up building hurdles to locate the structures, surveyed for services and footings and contractors have begun the installation of all underground services.

In the next fortnight we should start to see trenching for, and the pouring of concrete for footings, weather permitting.

Congratulations to Year Eleven student, Emily Barnes for her selection in the National Youth Science Forum, a project designed to inspire future scientists.

Emily will travel to Canberra for two weeks in January 2011 to test-drive the life of a scientist by experiencing the exciting breadth and depth of science and engineering-based careers. At the very heart of this programme will be a series of visits to the top research and industry facilities and the opportunity to talk to some of today's leading scientists who will shed a whole new perspective on the many and diverse fields of study giving young enthusiastic participants a new sense of possible direction.

Selection for the NYSF is highly competitive and only targets students throughout Australia who demonstrate high academic achievements in all areas of study. Those fortunate students chosen will experience 'labvisits' tuned to their areas of interest. Some will engage in a range of fields including physics, mathematics, computing, chemistry, biomedicine, animal and plant biology, earth and environmental studies and engineering. The aim of these visits is to inform, inspire and to challenge students to consider what working in the different science fields is really like.

Group visits to the National Universities specialising in scientific fields will include; CSIRO, Geoscience Australia, Australian Parliamentary House – Education Office, Conservation Laboratories, The Australian War Memorial and National Gallery of Australia, The Deep Space Tracking Facility at Tidbinbilla, ActewAGL Lower Molonglo Water Quality Control Centre and so many more options too numerous to mention.

Emily is a uniquely capable and most importantly, an objective and rational young woman who displays qualities far beyond her years in many respects. She justly deserves this opportunity as she prepared thoroughly by researching the field of her chosen science, environmental science. Her purposeful and



dedicated rehearsal for her interview, while taking on the guidance and advice offered to her, indicates the level of commitment to her application process. Her attention to detail together with her knowledge and understanding was very evident and this would have been recognised by the panel at her interview. A copy of her essay required as part of her application is included in this College Newsletter.

The College acknowledges and appreciates the generosity of the East Albany Rotary Club that has made a substantial donation to support Emily's science adventure at the National Youth Science Forum. Emily will attend a Rotary function and will present a presentation of her experiences early in 2011.

After introducing themselves on Wednesday morning, the members of the team got us moving around with games that put us a little bit out of our comfort zone, but pulled us into a cheerful, fun mood. We watched video clips and dramas performed by the team as well as interesting skits involving volunteers from our group that turned out to be full of motivating lessons on individuality, courage, compassion and more, teaching us how to strengthen or begin our relationship with God; Jesus even paid us a couple of visits. Some activities involved entire class participation, and among these were meditation, yoga and voicing our opinion. Some of the team members shared their moving stories of how they were drawn to God, and to the Youth Mission Team. At the end of each session our group would break up into smaller groups, to discuss with one of the team, issues that had been brought up during the previous workshop and our views on God, religion, the world and ourselves. These small groups were exceptionally effective in building trust and belief in ourselves, our group members, and everyone else.

Each workshop involved most or all of these activities and each of them left the Year Eleven students with broad, genuine smiles. After each break the team was also involved in playing basketball, netball, soccer and more with us and we were eager for every chance to muck around with the sporting equipment and the team.
