

Semi Final - St Joseph's v. Little Grove

The St Joseph's Eagle's Cup team were host to Little Grove in a cut throat Semi Final on Tuesday. With a steady breeze blowing to the northern end, careful use of the ball would be important to take advantage of the conditions. Being a Semi Final a high standard game was anticipated. St Joseph's were quickly out of the blocks, dominating possession and centre clearances with Jack Steel and Addison Dew combining well to deliver the ball into the St Josephs forward 50. However, the breeze was proving difficult to master with 6 behinds recorded before Nathan Griffiths broke the drought with the first of his 6 goals for the game. Little Grove were determined to provide a contest however, and were not to be denied with quick ball movement. They struck back with 2 majors in quick succession. St Joseph's steadied with 2 more goals before Quarter time.

St Joseph's began the second quarter, again dominating possession and mid field clearances to record their best quarter of football of the season with a dominating display for the term recording an impressive 8 goals. Corey Rogers broke free after a quiet first term kicking a long range goal himself and provided good supply to Declan Howarth who kicked 3, Lincoln Joy 2 and the crumbing Griffiths snagging another 2 for the term.

The Third Quarter saw St Joseph's rise to the challenge to keep pressure on Little Grove and improve on their First Quarter result. Fraser Powell provided strong run from defence to record a major on the run after linking through the mid field from a back pocket. Hamish Anderson made the most of his opportunities up forward with a strong mark 20m out and kicked truly to record the 4th goal of the term.

The last quarter saw Luke Dupuy given his customary opportunity up forward and as has been the case snapped truly to record another goal. A goal line to goal line effort from St Joseph's resulted in Jake Hooper who had provided smart running football with clean possession and accurate kicking record his second major for the day and cap off a fine effort from the St Joseph's side.

Well done to all players who did their bit throughout the game in a great team effort. With only 2 interchange available it was fantastic to hear and see everyone encourage each other. Bring on the Grand Final!

Seatbelt and Child Car Restraint Audits

As you may be aware new regulations governing the use of child car restraints will be introduced on 1 October 2010. The regulations will specify the type of restraint to be used according to a child's age. There will also be restrictions on where children aged 4 to 7 should be seated within a vehicle.

The changes to the laws are designed to ensure that children are better protected when travelling in cars.

In support of the changes to the laws and to assess the impact and uptake of the forthcoming legislation the Albany RoadWise committee will be conducting random audits of child car restraint and seatbelt usage at primary schools throughout Albany between August and October

OPEN TO

Your school will be contacted the day prior to an audit, as 'identifiable' volunteers from the local RoadWise Committee will be positioned outside your school dropoff and pick up zones. The audit will assess the number of adults and children restrained in seatbelts and/or child car restraints and where children are seated within vehicles.
