

Ric Charlesworth Comes to Albany

On Thursday 28 October, the Year 11 Physical Education Studies class were privileged to have the opportunity to listen to a sport psychology presentation by Olympic coach Ric Charlesworth. This opportunity was presented by the Lower Great Southern Hockey Association in conjunction with the Department of Sport and Recreation.

A little about Ric Charlesworth...

Ric Charlesworth was a mentor coach to five national team coaches with the Australian Institute of Sports and a High Performance Consultant with the Fremantle Dockers Football Club for two years. He is a doctor of medicine and a former captain of the Australian Hockey Team, the State Hockey Team and State Cricket Team. He was also a Federal member of parliament for 10 years. He retired this position to take up coaching the Australian Women's Hockey Team 1993 until Sydney 2000.

During the time he coached the Australian Women's Hockey Team they won the Champion's Trophy in 1993, 1995, 1997 and 1999, the World Cup in 1994 and 1998 and were gold medallists in the Atlanta Olympics 1996 and Sydney 2000 and Commonwealth Games 1998.

Ric Charlesworth played 227 times for Australia between 1972 and 1988. He was in 5 Olympics (1980 Moscow boycott) and 4 World Cups. He won an Olympic silver medal in 1976 and World Cup gold in 1986. In the 1986 World Cup he was player of the World Cup tournament and also leading goal scorer. Between 1972 and 1980 he played 1st Class cricket for Western Australia, Captaining the team in 1979.

Charlesworth's innovative approach to leadership and captaincy with the Hockeyroos was part of their winning formula for success. Charlesworth is noted for his ability to develop a leaderful team that maximises the contribution of every team member in a way never attempted in sport.

The presentation focussed on how you can develop strong mental skills to get the most out of your athletes as well as yourself. The main thing students seem to have come away with was the recurring theme of "focus on the task at hand, not the outcome".

Hopefully students gained a great deal from this presentation and Charlesworth's extraordinary experiences. It is rare to have such an accomplished person come to Albany to share his knowledge with students.



To help you make your decision, here are some details about some of the positions. Please note that it is not essential to attend all P & F meetings if you become part of the P & F, but you may need to provide a Report and regularly liaise with the Executive Committee.

Social Events/Fund Raising Committee - (More than one position)

Co-ordinate fundraising and social events during the year.

Footy Tipping Committee - (More than one position)

Co-ordinate the Footy Tipping Competition, includes sourcing prizes, book printing and distribution (P & F Committee and Year Reps help), collection of payments and distribution of winnings. A volunteer is also required to input everyone's tips and publish the results weekly for the twenty two weeks of the football season.

Koorong Kids Book Club Co-ordinator

Book Issues for the complete College are received once a term. The Co-Ordinator is responsible for the distribution of issues, (via Office) collection of orders and payments, ordering of books (online), and distribution to classes.

Scholastic Book Club Co-ordinator/s

Junior School — Issues are received up to twice a term. The Co-Ordinator is responsible for ordering and distribution of issues (via Office), collection of orders and payments, ordering of books (Online), and distribution to classes.

Scholastic Book Fair Co-ordinator/s

Junior School—to be held for one week in May. Responsibilities include advertising the event, setting up a book display and co-ordinating sales.

Parish Liaison

Inform Parish and P & F of events/activities occurring within both groups. Contact Kath in the Parish Office for Parish Report.

Year Representatives

Refer separate nomination form. Ideally two representatives per year level from Kindy – Year 12
