NAPLAN Assessment Programme 2011

Parents and guardians are reminded of the coming National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN): an annual assessment for students in Years Three, Five, Seven and Nine. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008.

On Tuesday 10, Wednesday 11 and Thursday 12 May, students will undertake the 2011 NAPLAN tests.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test but rather shows how individual students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children.

All students are encouraged to participate in the tests. Students with a disability may qualify for special provisions that reflect the support normally provided to them in the classroom.

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers. More information is available at www.naplan.edu.au

Inter-School Swimming Carnival - Middle and Senior Schools

Last Tuesday saw the culmination of the term's swimming for Middle and Senior School students with the Years Eight-Twelve Interschool swimming carnival. The team had high hopes of defending their back-to-back carnival wins from 2009 and 2010 despite a disappointing result from this years ACC carnival.

The carnival saw schools split into either Division 1 or 2 based on their 2010 results. St Joseph's College were competing against Albany Senior High School, Esperance Senior High School and Great Southern Grammar in Division 1.

The carnival started in fine style with some great results across all of the age groups with St Joseph's holding a narrow lead over Great Southern Grammar at the announcement of the first overall results. The situation swung between the schools all day with Great Southern Grammar holding a five-point lead before the commencement of the final freestyle relay events.
