

Dear Parents, Guardians, Families, Students and Members of our College Community.



The College ICT Committee, which meets monthly, is charged with ensuring the College ICT structure is kept up to date to allow ICT to assist the learning and teaching programme.

Currently the Committee is examining the merits of introducing a one-to-one laptop programme. This one-to-one programme would initially begin in early middle school as the Federal Government Computers for Schools funding has addressed many of the ICT issues and needs from Years Nine to Twelve.

The Personal Computer has become a vital tool to assist learning and a one-to-one programme would mean this tool is available to students beyond school hours.

A one-to-one programme would also reduce the number of text books required, as more digital texts come onto the market.

Thanks to Mr Watson for driving the bus, Mr Joy for goal umpiring and Mr Lott for washing the jumpers. Final Scores:



Senior School Examinations

Students in Years Ten, Eleven and Twelve will sit their Semester One Examinations commencing on Monday 30 May, and continue through until Friday 10 June. Thorough revision, seeking the assistance and guidance from teachers is highly recommended for all students to achieve pleasing results. All Senior School students have been given an examination timetable. Please note that a study day has been timetabled for Friday 27 May and all normal classes will resume on Monday 13 June. Additional copies of the Semester One Examination timetable can be collected from the College Administration Office.

SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS

Family support is a positive aspect for students during this time and social life should be kept to a minimum. Parents and carers can assist by encouraging their child to set a routine study plan, get plenty of healthy nutrition and sleep during this demanding period.

Each student is responsible for being at the College at least fifteen minutes before each examination and to come fully prepared. Full College uniform must be worn to each examination and if students elect to remain at the College to study in the Library they will also be required to be in College uniform.

Students in Years Eleven and Twelve involved in Workplace Learning and Vocational Education and Training Certificates will be required to complete the St John Ambulance Basic First Aid qualifications as this is a compulsory course qualification. All students will be informed of the date and times that they will be required to attend St John Ambulance to complete this qualification. In addition, Workplace Learning placement interviews will be scheduled during this two week period. Students are also encouraged to approach their workplace supervisor to negotiate additional hours at their place of 'employment'. All students will be informed of their interview times and the requirements for these interviews. All of the above time schedules will be included in the formal College Semester One Examination Timetable schedule.

Students who have any outstanding work or require some extra assistance with their studies should take advantage of their non exam time they have to complete any outstanding assessments/assignments to consolidate their results before commencing their Semester Two studies.

Teachers will be discussing this opportunity with students and parents/guardians are asked to support this College initiative. In addition, to assist students enrolled in Visual Arts, tutorials have been timetabled and all students will be required to attend to ensure completion of their Visual Art portfolio requirements by due dates.

A reminder that all absences for illness must be notified by phone to the College Administration Office and a medical certificate is to be presented to avoid penalties.

- Volunteer Grants 2011 recognises the important role of Australia's volunteers and is part of the Government's ongoing commitment to supporting volunteers, assisting disadvantaged communities and encouraging social inclusion to assist vulnerable individuals, families and communities. Funding of \$16 million is available to eligible not-for-profit community organisations to assist their volunteers and encourage volunteering.
- Volunteer Grants 2011 provides funding of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to not-for-profit organisations to:
 - Purchase portable, tangible, small equipment items to help volunteers
 - Contribute to the reimbursement of fuel costs for their volunteers who use their own car to transport others to activities, deliver food and assist people in need
 - Contribute to the reimbursement of transport costs incurred by volunteers with disability who are unable to drive
 - Contribute to the costs of training courses and/ or undertake background screening checks for volunteers.
