

Sorry Day offers the community the opportunity to be involved in activities to acknowledge the impact of forcible removal on Australia's indigenous people.

Students at last week's Junior School Assembly observed National Sorry Day with a short speech about the meaning of Sorry Day read by Year Four student Jacob Muir followed by a minutes silence as a sign of respect for the Stolen Generation.

The following day our indigenous students supported by Teacher Assistant Mrs Alisia Anderson planted a native hibiscus tree at the front of the College. The purple flower of this hibiscus is the national emblem of the Stolen Generation and denotes compassion and spiritual healing.

## Chloe Sets Her Sights on Parliament

Year Ten student Leader, Chloe Thornton, has been selected to participate in the Legislative Council in the 2011 State-wide Student Parliament, an initiative by the Parliament of WA. Chloe is one of six regional WA students that



have been selected to represent her region at the Student Parliament in August 2011; this acknowledges the centenary of secondary and tertiary education in Western Australia.

The College congratulates Chloe on her selection to represent the Albany region and we will formally acknowledge her at a College assembly later in the term.

Following is a reflection by Chloe on the preparations involved in undertaking this opportunity.

My teacher, Mrs Wood, nominated me for this course. From there I had to fill in an application justifying why I was a good candidate and should be selected. Mrs Wood worked with me in finalising my application. Many children from all around Western Australia also sent in their applications.

The program is designed to get an understanding of schooling around Western Australia and to discuss matters important to school children and their districts. The organising committee will be sending me a resource package with topics they would be interested in me presenting, together with views of other young people of my age group. I intend to liaise with the office of Hon. Brian Ellis, MLC to prepare my final notes.

The course requires me to give an Address-in-Reply speech about my local region, a short statement on an issue important to me and a matter of interest or relevance in the Albany district. I will also be part of the Parliamentary Question Time, where I will be able to pose questions and answer others questions about my region. All this would require me to read up on local and regional issues and be open minded on the different views of all types of people in our region. This is a wonderful experience and opportunity. I feel very privileged to represent my school, St Joseph's College and the Albany district.
