Year 10 Outdoor Education Winter Expedition 2011 Report

Students were in control of their walking pace, breaks and navigation. A very comfortable pace was set along the stunning coastal track and we arrived at Cosy Corner by lunchtime for a well earned rest. The beach walk from there to Torbay Inlet was the final test for the day, with several students realising that they were beginning to get tired. The water crossing may have dampened some shoes and socks for those who simply waded through, or those who thought they could make the jump and stay dry (no more to be said!) but it certainly did not dampen spirits. Arriving at camp late in the afternoon was then a welcome sight for some who were ready to set up camp, cook, swim and fish.

Once the tents were set up, some students were soon cooking their meals, while the campfire was lit (for warmth and marshmallow toasting), and a couple of very brave souls braved the icy inlet waters. Unfortunately the fishermen failed to deliver on this occasion.

Albany's winter decided it was time to test the students overnight, and the rain settled in for the long haul. This left several with wading pools in tents and very wet gear. The perfect lesson as to what the south coast

can deliver and therefore considerations for future choice of equipment and clothing! Considering this, spirits were still reasonably high.

The College's fabulous groundsmen, Mr Dave Pickering and Mr John Scheepers, for helping us set up (and letting us change our mind, thank you).


