

SCHOLARSHIPS

Curtin University Scholarships 2012

Nominations are now being called from Years 11 and 12 cohort in 2011 for the following scholarships:

- John Curtin Undergraduates Scholarship: A continuing scholarship to reward and assist students who will be newly enrolled at Curtin University in Semester 1 2012 who can demonstrate academic excellence, leadership qualities and engagement in community service. Year 12 students must be nominated by their High School Principal. Mature age applicants must be nominated by a professional educator.
- Create Your Future Scholarship: A continuing scholarship to assist students newly enrolled in Semester 1 2012 who are from low SES backgrounds and show academic potential, leadership qualities and engagement in community service. Special consideration will also be given to students who have faced adverse personal circumstances or financial hardship. Year 12 students must be nominated by their High School Principal.
- 3. Curtin Principal's Recommendation Award: A oneoff payment to assist with costs associated with studying. WA high school Principals can nominate two students based on any of the following criteria: Academic merit or showing most improvement during their high school studies or potential to achieve at university or financial difficulties or overcoming adverse personal circumstances. Receiving the Curtin Principal's Recommendation Award will not preclude the student from receiving other awards or scholarships.
