## Western Australian Monitoring Standards in Education 2011

Parents and Guardians will have received an information brochure relating to the MSE assessments for all students in Years Five, Seven and Nine.

The assessment program is offered to all Western Australian schools in the Public, Catholic and many Independent schools.

## What is assessed in Years 5, 7 and 9? Science

Students' achievement in the four conceptual outcomes and the process outcome, *Investigating*, is assessed.

#### **Society and Environment**

Students' achievement in the five conceptual outcomes and the process outcome, *Investigation*, *Communication and Participation (ICP)*, is assessed.

Students will be well prepared for these assessments by their teachers.

#### Who develops the assessments?

The assessments have been developed specifically for Western Australian schools by the Department of Education and the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER).

#### When will the assessments be conducted?

The assessments will take place as part of the normal school day during the third week of Term 3 (8 to 12 August 2011).

#### **Reporting (Junior and Middle Schools)**

As mentioned at Parent Meetings earlier in the year, there is a significant change in the reporting assessment structure for all schools in 2011 to meet the requirements of the new Australian Curriculum. Schools will be no longer reporting in levels but in grades. The grading will be based on an A-E scale. The six grade descriptors are:
