St Joseph's Cup



Year Ten Science - Recycling

On Monday 24 October the Year Ten Applied Science class went on an excursion to the Albany Recycling Facilities and Recycling Education Centre. The students were met by Carly, an on-site educator, who tested their knowledge of what gets recycled with a short question and answer session. Some very good questions were asked before Carly elaborated on why certain things can or cannot be recycled. She also told us some interesting facts such as plastic only having two lives whereas aluminium can be recycled over and over again. Up to 99% of the parts in electrical appliances can be recycled and one mobile phone battery can contaminate several thousand tons of compost.

We were then shown around the facility where the actual sorting of our recycle bins contents takes place, before moving into the tip shop. The tip shop sells items which someone has discarded, but that are still usable.

Last but not least everyone got to dress up with safety equipment in the Educational Centre, was assigned a role in a pretend-facility with conveyor belt and miniature truck, clean rubbish was sorted by the students just like in the real facilities.

Year Ten Applied Science had a good time observing and learning how recycling works after our bins are picked up.
