### Marine Scientist Visits Year Seven

On Monday 5 November, St Joseph's College was privileged to host Professor Carlos Duarte, a marine scientist based for part of the year at the University of Western Australia. The Professor regaled the Year Seven classes with tales of his voyages across all Seven Seas and many stops in between.

Students were afforded an insight into the life of marine scientists and the equipment they use, including bongos, giant butterfly nets and remote controlled bottles. Professor Duarte is passionate about the role that young people can play as agents of change in the world in which we live.
