

The Year Seven school immunisation programme will be moving to high school.

2013 - Years Eight, Nine and Ten boys will be offered the HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) vaccine – Australia is the first country to offer it free to boys.

2014 - the Year Seven immunisation programme will now be offered to this years Year Six students in Year Eight. So if your child is in Year Six this year they will not receive any vaccines until they are in Year Eight.

Parents of 4 Year Olds - Immunisations

Children who have turned 4 years of age are scheduled to received 2 injections, MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) and DTP – IPV (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough, and Polio) vaccines. These are booster doses to ensure good levels of coverage against these life threatening diseases. These immunisations can now be given as early as 3.5 years of age.

From 1 July 2012, families need to have their children fully immunized or have an approved exemption to receive the Family Tax Benefit Part A end-of-year supplement.

Junior School News

The supplement, worth \$726 per child each year, will now only be paid once a child is fully immunised at one, two and five years of age, or has an approved exemption. This means that over the three immunisation check points, families will have an incentive of more than \$2,100.

If your child still requires his/her immunisations please see your usual immunisation provider or alternatively you are welcome to make an appointment for our Tuesday / Thursday Grey Street Albany immunisation clinic. This is a free service, and appointments can be made by phoning 9842 7500.
