## Senior School News

### Albany Career Expo 2013

Forty Six Year Ten students attended the 2013 Career Expo held at Great Southern Institute of Technology on Friday 14 June. The Expo provided students with the opportunity to access information on jobs, university study, vocational training, apprenticeships and traineeships as well as career guidance all in the same location.

This year the students had the opportunity to listen to Jase Schroeder, a skilled communicator who is extremely passionate about bringing positive change and seeing people live their potential. Using amusing anecdotes and interesting analogies, Jase soon had the group warming to him and becoming actively involved in the presentation.

With an energetic and at times hilarious re-enactment of his first meeting with the girl who was to become his wife, Jase's opening message was "Don't try to impress but be impressive by being the best version of you." Jase outlined three premises which underpin that message.

The first used the immenseness of the Grand Canyon to make the point that if the students thought that they had discovered their potential, it was only a small part of what they have. The premise that "there is more in me than currently what I see" is a fundamental belief to ensure that the students don't limit their potential. What is important to achieve their potential is self-esteem. Students need to believe in themselves and have faith in their abilities. In other words "be comfortable in their own skin."

Supported with anecdotal evidence, Jase considered the impact of thoughts and in particular negative thoughts on realising potential. With students actively involved, Jase compared thoughts with a bus journey in that they take you somewhere. The students were left in no doubt that negative thoughts will minimise their potential and their enjoyment of life as it becomes more of a chore than an adventure. The 'life bus' will allow students to maximize their natural talent, have a positive outlook and develop a quality work ethic. With these thoughts life is a learning, growing adventure, one which will lead to success.

As a conclusion, Jase looked at how the dung beetle was able to find the way back to its habitat with its ball of dung, to communicate to the students that it was critical to have some direction in life. Jase emphasised that it was important that the students ask the following questions; "Who do I want to be?" and "What do I want to be?" It was important for students to envisage the future.

Judging by the rapturous applause for Jase at the conclusion of his presentation and the animated chatter as the students left the room, there is no doubt that his energetic presentation had left an impression on the group.

The students spent the remaining time at the Expo visiting the various exhibitors to gain information which will help them to make informed decisions in their final years of schooling and in the immediate post school period.
